Call to Order. Gus called the meeting to order at 6:32 pm.

Minutes

The minutes of the April meeting were distributed to the membership for review. Gus asked if there were any changes or corrections. There was one correction; Sue said that 'Magic Kingdom' should be changed to 'Wizard's Kingdom'. Sue moved to approve the minutes; Lisa seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer Report

The financial report was distributed showing checking & savings account activity and balances for the periods 4/15/21 - 5/20/21. Jerry stated that although income is down because there was no 2020 Fair, there is still more than enough money in the checking and savings accounts for the 2021 Fair. Kevin asked about the propane tank rental charge vs. purchasing a tank. Jerry explained that ERFA has been leasing the tank for years. Doug stated that most companies no longer sell tanks and that they are also very expensive to purchase. Sue moved to accept the treasurer's report. Doug seconded. Motion carried.

Old Business

- Timber Hall Update. Jerry said that the next event at Timber Hall is on June 5.
- Snowplow Damage: Jerry said that there was no new news and that he would be in touch with County about repairs.
- Grant for Timber Hall Doors/Go Fund Me Page: Tabled until the next meeting.

New Business

- Burn out competition for muscle cars: Tabled until the next meeting.
- Grandstand repairs/materials list: Floyd said he looked over the stand determined what repairs are need.
- Arena events: Lisa stated that there will be a Barrel Run in June. In addition, she made a motion that the Fair purchase an electronic sports timer for arena events. Gus asked how often it would be used. Lisa replied that the timer would be used for any arena event; so at least four or five times a year and that she wasn't comfortable borrowing a timer anymore. After further discussion Lisa

- moved that the Fair purchase an electronic sports timer. Sue seconded. Motion carried by unanimous consent.
- Parade Volunteer: Gus stated that we need a volunteer to organize the Parade and asked about running an ad for a volunteer in the Flying Finn. Janine said that she would take care of running the ad.

Standing Fair Committees:

- Fairbook Amber said she is still working on the Fairbook.
 Jerry pointed out that the Horseshoe Tournament should be removed from the Fairbook.
- Exhibits & Livestock Building Gus asked Amber when she
 will need help in the livestock building. She asked for
 assistance in July.
- Mud Run Floyd said the sanctions were paid. He also said that ½ dozen planks in the stand need to be replaced. Gus said that there are hornets in the railroad ties and the ties should also be replaced.
- Dog Show Jerry said that Bonnie has helpers for the Dog Show.
- Horse Show Lisa said that there are no events for the arena on Friday or Saturday of Fair weekend. The membership briefly discussed potential events and is looking for ideas.
- Team Penning Frank said that three of four panels that Team Penning needs are being paid for through donations, so the Fair will only need to buy one. Jerry stated that money has been set aside the money to pay for the panel. Doug stated that this year the belt buckles cost \$714.00. He said the Team Penning buckles will be donated and asked the Fair to pay for the rest if possible. Jerry said that it is not problem for the Fair to purchase the rest of the buckles and, Jerry also pointed out that over the years Team Penning has made substantial contributions to the Fair.
- Flying Finn Fun Run Holly said that two years ago the Fun Run began using undated t-shirts, so she can use the leftover shirts and will not need to purchase as many as in previous years. She said that she will have a quote for tshirts and the medal at the next meeting.
- Bags Tournament (cornhole) Kevin asked if it would be okay to run the tournament for two days. The membership discussed if this would interfere with other fairground activities like the Dog Sow and Kid's Games, and it was determined that it would not. Kevin stated that he purchased new boards for the tournament and asked where they could be stored indoors. Jerry said he could find a place inside Timber Hall.
- Demolition Derby Floyd said he will continue to work out what materials are needed to for the grandstand.
- Vendors Janine said that so far, there are sixteen vendors inside Timber Hall. Sue said that there are four food vendors on the grounds and Ophelia will be serving food inside Timber Hall. Gus suggested displaying farm equipment on the grounds and offered look into it.

Miscellaneous

Roland pointed out that the exit lights inside Timber Hall are not working.

Gus said that we should look into getting gravel to level the tarmac area around Timber Hall.
