## Town of Embarrass

### Regular Board Meeting

August 11, 2021

PENDING BOARD APPROVAL

Visitors: Paul Knuti, Roland Fowler

Present: Gene Wright, Roy Worsham, Bernie Mettler, Mary Novak, Jennifer Boese

Meeting was called to order at 6:03 p.m. by Wright with The Pledge of Allegiance.

*Motion/Worsham: Second/Wright to approve the July 2021 minutes. Carried 3-0.*

*Motion/Worsham: Second/Wright to approve the Treasurer's Report. Carried 3-0.*

Landowner Ed Matonich asking supervisors to give a cartway through the middle of township property. *Motion/Worsham: Second/ Wright an easement was originally given to go along side of township property for Matonich to log, but no cartway will be given to go down the middle. Carried 3-0.*

Road Report given by Worsham. Roads are in good condition. Complaint on Hanka Nevala Road was addressed. Worsham explains that the reason it has been graded the way in question is to keep the grass from growing in and was graded properly. *Motion/Wright: Second/Worsham to raise grader operator wage as requested to twenty dollars an hour at the next reorganizational meeting January 2022. Carried 3-0.*

Campground Report: Campground running smooth and been busy. Fully booked for the fair weekend. Amptek proposal for electrical upgrade was reviewed. Supervisors agree that this upgrade needs to be done to provide the campsites with the amps needed to for RVs and would like the clerk to continue with applying for grants to help with the funding. Supervisors would like to get an estimate for the water lines to be replaced at the same time the electrical work is done. The dump station work to start soon, permit was received. The pea rock in front of shower house is not handicap accessible. Clerk to contact C & C Wingers for estimate on concrete pad to make handicap accessible.

Maintenance Report given by Worsham. *Motion/Wright: Second/Mettler for Wright to find someone to trap the family of skunks at the ball field and pay the rate charged. Carried 3-0.* Concession stand was broken into, sheriff notified. Handicap parking area at Post Office can be painted by maintenance with stencil.

Restroom Project Report: Clerk informs the supervisors the restroom is finished being constructed, currently waiting on stamped drawing and state approval before it can be shipped. Once stamped drawings are received clerk can apply for permit. Parking lot area at the Information/Visitor Center to be filled and graded after restrooms have been installed.

Cemetery deeds were signed. *Motion/Wright: Second/Worsham to have cremains moved to new site as it was asked of by family. Carried 3-0.*

Clerk explains that there has been digging graves and placing of markers without notifying the township ahead of time, making it difficult to keep accurate records. Supervisors would like it noted that no burials are to be made without notifying the clerk's office. The site needs to be properly marked and recorded with the Town Clerk before any burials can be done. Leaning headstones at the cemetery are a concern and need to be taken care of. Clerk has looked for contact information but unable to find. Cemetery sexton is currently hospitalized, so a temporary sexton is needed. Supervisors to meet with lead maintenance to discuss this issue until sexton is found.

Supervisors want it noted that to speak at meeting, clerk must be notified by noon the day of the meeting to be placed on agenda.

*Motion/Worsham: Second/Mettler to compensate clerk for grant work and a separate hourly wage for grant work from this point forward, clerk is not required to work out of the office or on grants and has been without being compensated properly. Clerk to keep track of all time doing grant work and all other hours worked out of office. Carried 3-0.*

First half of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding was received. Clerk provides information packets to supervisors on use of funds. More discussion will be held on ARPA funds and the best way to use them. *Motion/Wright: Second/Worsham for Clerk to check on*

*getting a contractor estimate for town hall roof. Carried 3-0. Gene to be notified when contractor can come.*

*Motion/Wright: Second/Mettler to pay Embarrass Region Volunteer Fire Department agreement for \$27,949.41. Carried 3-0.*

*Motion/Wright: Second/Mettler to accept the claims (17879-17906, \$42,833.85) and correspondence. Carried 3-0.*

Worsham turns in resignation as board supervisor for the end of September. *Motion/Wright: Second/Mettler to accept resignation, however to stay on until find replacement. Worsham agrees. Carried 2-0.*

Audit was completed by supervisors; all was found accurate and in order.

Meeting adjourned by Wright at 7:50 p.m.

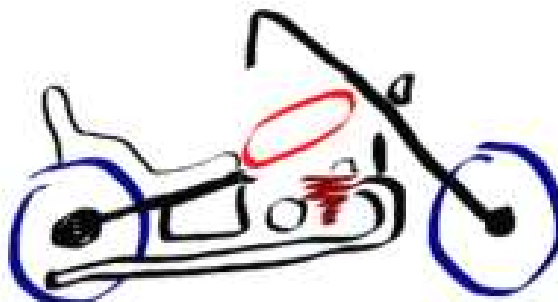

**Minutes Approval:** *Steve moved to approve the June 2, 2021 Regular Meeting minutes as read and the Annual Road Inspection Minutes. Carrie supported. Carried (3-0).*

**Treasurer's Report:** Receipts for today: EVFCU quarterly interest: \$52.52 and St. Louis County tax apportionment: \$21,991.23. Total Disbursements for June 2, 2021: \$1,890.01. *Steve accepted the Treasurer's Report and Mike supported. Carried (3-0). Mike approved the transfer of \$22,123.35 from the General Fund to the Fire Fund to pay the Fire Contract for one year. Carrie supported. Carried (3-0).*

**Approval to Pay Bills:** *Steve moved to approve payment of the bills listed below plus payroll and PERA with support from Mike. Carried (3-0).*

**Address Visitors:** Mike Rhein from the Babbitt Ambulance Service and Glenn Anderson, a member of the Babbitt City Council and the Safety Committee, spoke to the board in an appeal to ask that a levy of at least \$10.50 be added to each of Waasa household's County tax bill to subsidize the ambulance service. Babbitt has already been levied \$33.00/household. They maintain that Babbitt Ambulance Service is still the cheapest in Northern MN. Costs keep going up such as payroll since the service has been required to have people on-call 7 days a week. Also, a new ambulance needed to be purchased recently to the tune of \$250,000.00. More volunteers are sought since they are short-handed. Any support we can give would be appreciated. The Clerk stated that the best time to bring this appeal to the residents of the township would be at the March 2022 Annual Meeting. It will be added to the agenda now.

**Road Report:** The town board made their annual inspection all township roads on June 26<sup>th</sup>. Roads were in good condition at that time. Steve will monitor each road and order blading done when needed. He will also see that the Heikkila Road sign is put back up. A downed tree was recently removed from Koskela Road.

**Cemetery Report:** Greg Zillmer will be laid to rest on July 10. Steve removed a tree that was leaning on the fence in the new section of the cemetery.

**Old Business:** Steve checked with Mesabi Sign Company about installing our signs but they declined. A test installation will be done soon.

**New Business:** The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) will be researched more before an application is made. What can it be spent on and can the money be transferred to another entity are some of the questions/concerns. Funds must be spent by the end of September 2024.

**Correspondence:** Mail was read and filed.

**Adjournment:** *Mike moved to close the meeting at 8:05 p.m. and was supported by Steve.*

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# Embarrass Region Fair Meeting Minutes

August 19, 2021  
Pending Approval

Call to Order. Gus called the meeting to order at 6:32 pm.

## Minutes

The minutes of the July 15th meeting were distributed to the membership for review. Gus asked for any changes, additions or corrections. There was one correction to the minutes; under miscellaneous "Need to check on the Facebook page and is the administrator" is changed to "Need to find out who is the administrator of the Facebook page". Jerry moved to accept the minutes. Jim seconded. Motion carried.

## Treasurer Report

The financial report was distributed showing checking & savings account activity and balances for the month of July. Jerry said that money was transferred from savings to checking for change for the Fair and that it will be transferred back to savings when the Fair is over. Money was also transferred from savings to checking to pay for awards & trophies. Jerry also reported that in order to simplify bookkeeping, he closed extraneous savings accounts. Sherie asked about Fair Book ad sales. Jerry replied that he doesn't have a final number yet, but ad sales did cover the cost of printing the Fairbook and then some; this includes any refunds due to mistakes. Kevin asked about the Northland Fire Safety charge and Jerry explained that it was for a safety test, which is required every ten years. Craig asked about the A-1 Services charge and Jerry said it was for porta-potties from a Barrel Racing event and the charge was for three days but should have been for only one day. Craig said he would look into it. Sue moved to accept the treasurer's report. Kevin seconded. Motion carried.

## Old Business

- Timber Hall. Jerry stated that the new black top for the driveway should be completed next week. Gus said in order to keep traffic off the new blacktop, it will be blocked-off to cars during the Fair. Gus said that the exit signs inside Timber Hall need to be working for the Fair. Jerry said he ordered new LEDs but didn't know if they would arrive in time. Gus said he would get batteries for the old exit lights and make sure they are working.
- Grandstand repairs. Floyd said that he is removing a badly deteriorated section of the grandstand.

## New Business

- Help for the ticket gates. It was announced that only the north ticket gate will be open on Friday. The need for more volunteers, especially for the south gate was discussed and members signed – up to work shifts at the ticket gates. Roland said he found four volunteers to work at the gates.

## Standing Fair Committee Reports:

Fairbook. Jerry said that next year there will be separate meeting for proofing the Fairbook and the Fairbook will contain a table of contents for advertisers and events. Gus said that Sue Morolt volunteered to help with the Fairbook and advertising.

Livestock Barn & Exhibit Building. Gus stated that the Livestock Barn is set-up and the new panels look good, and that the Exhibit Barn is also set-up and ready to go.

Entertainment. Tom said that line up is ready for Saturday Night Live, and Karaoke is ready to go.

Race for All Ages. Gus said that Nicole is in charge of the kids' games and everything is ready to go.

Softball Tournament. There are nine teams for the softball tournament.

Mud Run. Floyd said everything is ready.

Dog Show. Bonnie said Dog Show is good to go.

Horse Show. Terri said that the Horse Show is ready to go.

Team Penning. Doug said that there are still raffle tickets for sale.

Bags Tournament. Kevin said that he would like to sink a couple of posts and put up a temporary scoreboard. Gus said that was fine.

Classic Car & Truck Show. Darwin said everything is ready. Gus said there will be a tent and porta-potty by the Car Show. Sue was concerned about the cars



entering through the south gate without paying admission. Craig said the south side of the car show will be fenced off so cars can't enter there. Gus stated that he will put up a sign to direct the classic cars to the north gate to pay admission before entering the car show area.

Flying Finn Fun Run. Holly said that the additional T-shirts were ordered and should be ready in time for the Fair.

Demolition Derby. Jim said everything was ready.

Parade. Jim reported that the Babbitt Band will be in the parade and that he will need a check for their fee. Jerry said he would have the check ready on the day of the parade. Jim asked Darwin to see if any of the classic cars would like to participate in the parade. Roland said he is working on getting a color guard. Jim suggested that the color guard ride in a convertible, especially if it's a hot day.

Vendors. Janine said that vendors spaces inside Timber Hall are almost full. There are two vendors outside under the eaves and St. Louis County Soil & Water Conservation will be under the eaves on Saturday only. She also reported that the Fair received a \$250 donation from Lulich Implement. Jerry said that Fair also received a \$1,000 donation from the Babbitt Golf Course.

Sue announced that this year the Toy Box will be at the Fair for three days instead of just one, Northland Lawn & Sport will display John Deere tractors on the grounds, and Penny Moes will have pony rides for kids. Sue also said that St. Louis County will provide free Covid-19 vaccines on Saturday from 9:00 to 3:00. They will be set-up near the horse arena.

Fair Security, Porta-potties & garbage pick-up. Craig said port-potties are good to go. Jerry said the dumpsters are on weekly pick-up and that G-Men will bring a large dumpster for the Fair. Sue asked who was responsible for keeping the restrooms clean. Janine said that in the past she and Chrissy and Bonnie checked on them throughout the day and that seemed to work. It was agreed that we will monitor the restrooms the same way this year. Sherrie is waiting for a response from VCC regarding security.

### Miscellaneous

- Shireen Lee and Jill Waisanen proposed holding two craft shows, as fundraisers for the Fair, at Timber Hall. Shireen suggested November 11, 12 & 13 and December 9, 10 & 11. Jerry said he would

have to see if craft shows are covered by our insurance. Sherie and other members thought the craft shows were a good idea. Jerry said that members will vote on it at the next meeting.

Sue suggested putting out a donation bucket, during the Fair to help raise money for new Timber Hall doors. Gus asked members to bring a list of tasks that must be done after the Fair to the next meeting on August 26. Kevin said he would put up the flag.

Motion to adjourn was made seconded. Motion carried. Gus adjourned the meeting at 7:36 p.m.
