Meeting called to order by LaMar at 6:03 p.m. with Pledge of Allegiance.

October 2023 minutes reviewed and approved as written. Motion by LaMar-Garman/Lee. Carried 3-0.

Cash Control financial report reviewed. Clerical errors corrected.

Cemetery Road discussed by supervisors. Garman discusses looking for pins for lot marking and future expansion suggest excavating of rock.

Road Report by Lee. Lee would like it noted in the minutes that she was confronted in the past about the chloride on the roads and thought maybe she made a mistake. Information she was given thought she was to make that decision. Roads were not chloride for three years so the past money was not used and will be partially reimbursed from FEMA grant applied for. The air quality from the dust on the roads for the residents was not good. Also learned that chloride does strengthen the roads and less expenses down the road. So making the decision may have been in error. Lee apologizes. There was a grant that was going to be applied for but after gathering information the township is not eligible at this time as the cost for engineering would be required by township and that is not in the budget. Grant opportunity will be available again and maybe will be able to get in the position for applying in the future. Resolution will be completed after more information is found on recommendations of chloride.

Maintenance Report given by Lee. Motion by Lee-LaMar/Garman to approve maintenance to purchase chainsaw. Carried 3-0. Requests for white strip to be put back on steps.

Cemetery Deeds were signed by supervisors and clerk.

LaMar discusses advertising ideas at the skating rink, discussion had. Motion by LaMar-Garman/Lee to purchase rink liner. Carried 3-0.

Lee challenges residents and businesses, if possible, to make and place a few candles on their properties on December 16 during the Ice Candle Event.

The clerk speaks to say FEMA grant application is in the final process of approval. One more on-site inspection to be held with FEMA reps.

Knuti discusses the Pyhala Homestead and talks with the supervisors about the history of the property, hopes to give better understanding on the Pyhala Homestead.

Motion LaMar-Lee/Garman to approve the claims and correspondence. Carried 3-0.

Meeting adjourned 8:49 p.m.

Minutes Approval: Steve moved to approve the September 6, 2023 Meeting Minutes. Eric supported. Carried (3-0).

Treasurer's Report: Receipts for September were \$55.88 from Building Fund Savings quarterly dividend Embarrass Vermilion Federal C.U. Disbursements totaled \$2,001.98. Mike approved the Treasurer's report with Steve supporting. Carried (3-0).

Road Report: Township roads were inspected a day ago and are in good condition with the exception of Beckman Road which has a pothole. Rock, Snow & Fire will haul gravel & grade as many roads as he can before winter weather sets in. Beckman, Dale and Niemi roads will have priority.

Cemetery: Steve has been doing a fall clean up and hauled trash from the barrel at the cemetery. Most people have removed decorations and planters from graves by the October 1 deadline.

Steve dug and observed the cremation burial of Floyd Tenquist on October 1 on the Wilho Porspakka family lot.

Old Business: Eric, Steve, and Sandy have been working with FEMA for several weeks. Julia Thomas is our main contact for the 8033 Niemi Road spring flood site. Yesterday the three met with two FEMA site inspectors and two EHP reps.

It will be another week before FEMA will give us their recommendations. Some of the questions we have is the

amount of Class 5 coverage required and whether a culvert permit is needed at the site. It was stressed that it is important to have the work done before winter weather. FEMA may cover 75% of our costs.

The brush piles have been hauled away from the town hall yard and the tree on the south side of the hall was trimmed by a volunteer.

New window blinds for the office and the main meeting room will be ordered online by Mike.

MATIT has not, as of this date, returned our inquiry about needing added coverage for the new hall windows.

New Business: Linda Koskela's hall rental went well on October 1. Non-residents are interested in renting the town hall on December 24 but have not submitted their check to hold the date.

Near the conclusion of the meeting, a motion was made by Mike and supported by Steve to accept an adjusted price quote from Rock, Sand & Fire for work needed done at the end of Niemi Road. Carried (3-0).

Correspondence: All mail was read and filed.

Adjournment: Mike moved to close the meeting at 7:50 p.m. and was supported by Steve. Carried.

Call to order: The meeting was called to order at 6:30.

Minutes:

- Sarah made a motion to approve the minutes from the October 12, meeting. Carissa seconded. Motion carried by unanimous consent.
- In order to save time at meetings the Board will try out voting to approve the minutes by email.

Grant Committee – Tana reported that the grant application to fund the Timber Hall improvement Pre-Design costs was submitted to the IRRRB.

Volunteer Committee – Carissa said that the Committee continues to work on collecting/updating volunteer contact information. The Committee was given a demonstration of Point volunteer software. Volunteers are beginning to use the software. Carissa is looking for people to help input volunteer hours into Point software.

Finance Committee – Janine is still working on 2024 Budget. Finance Committee will meet with Strategic Planning Committee to determine guidelines to handle requests for large ticket items.

Marketing Committee - Carissa gave update on Give to the Max Fundraisers.

Nominating & Governance – Sarah read (2nd reading) the proposed amendment to the bylaws, Section 5. Amending the bylaws. The Volunteer Pledge was tabled until January. Events Committee – The Committee held its first meeting on Nov. 7. Nine attended. Carissa said that Event Coordinators are collaborating with other organizations on the Winter Festival. Sue is working to organize Bingo every other month at Timber Hall.

Due to rising food prices, especially butter and ham the Board found it necessary increase the price of the Pancake Breakfast by a \$1 starting in January 2024.

 Jerry made a motion to raise the price of the Pancake Breakfast to \$7 for adults and \$4 for children, to take effect in January 2024. Motion carried by unanimous consent.
