May 11, 2022

PENDING BOARD APPROVAL

Present: Jack LaMar, Gene Wright, Bernie Mettler (via zoom)
Mary Novak, Jennifer Boese

Meeting called to Order with the Pledge of Allegiance, by LaMar at 6:05 p.m.

Mettler zoomed into meeting. Mettler gives his resignation to the Embarrass Town Board. Board and others thank Mettler for his service on the township board. Motion/LaMar: Second/Wright to accept Bernie Mettler's resignation as township supervisor. Carried 2-0.

Motion/LaMar: Second/Wright to appoint Alyssa Hammond as township maintenance supervisor to complete Mettler's term until the November election. Carried 2-0. Wright would like it noted that he is abstaining from voting as he is related to Hammond, therefore clerk will vote. LaMar and Boese vote. Yays: 2 Nays: 0 Hammond sworn in as supervisor.

Motion/Wright: Second/LaMar to approve the April 2022 minutes. Carried 3-0.

Motion/Wright: Second/LaMar to transfer \$7,000 from historical fund and \$8,000 from Capitol Fund and put into the general fund. Carried 3-0. Motion/Wright: Second/Hammond to approve the treasurers report with the transfer of the funds. Carried 3-0.

Jerimiah Johnson for speaks the Best Little League. Asks if sod could be cut back some on the base lines, mainly the first base. Wright informs Johnson that having the field rolled is something that Little League should take care of and the base lines and suggests speaking with Wingers to see what they could do. New field requirements are being required by Little League Association next year on the field size. Supervisors would like Johnson to put a proposal together on what needs to be done and how much the cost would be then a decision could be made if the township is able to help with funding. It was asked if the township has ever run the little league and answered it has always been run by volunteers such as parents. Looking for parents to run the concession stand.

Shireen Lee talks with the board about the market held at the town hall and is wanting to have it held at another location. Lee and the supervisors discuss other locations. Decision was made to have at the weather station.

Township land and property is being questioned by the board on the lease agreement that was done years ago and will be asked about at the reconvened LBAE meeting.

Maintenance Report. Grader annual maintenance completed. All roads were graded and with them being soft will go out in another two weeks. Town Hall and pole barn was re-keyed. A1 service pumped tank at Post Office. Trees downed were cleared from roadways.

Heritage Park and Campground is open for the season with Roy and Lori Worsham returning as caretakers. Caretakers are asking for township to purchase a washer and dryer for the campground. Supervisors discuss and agree to not purchase at this time but to possibly place on budget for next year. Motion/Wright: Second/Alyssa to change the weekly camping fee from \$185 to \$165. LaMar nay. Carried 2-1. Culligan water softener concerns are had by maintenance. After discussion had, LaMar is to follow up with lead maintenance. Motion/Wright: Second/LaMar to replace lights with LED lights at the shower house. LaMar to follow up with maintenance and report back at June meeting. Carried 3-0.

Motion/Wright: Second/LaMar to transfer \$5,000 donation received by the Clerk for the Embarrass Fire Department from the American Legion Post 241 in Aurora. Carried 3-0.

Cemetery Deeds signed by board.

Flowerpots wanted by the Flower Club to replace the rotted flower boxes were tabled until work is completed at the Information Center.

Motion/Wright: Second/LaMar to allow Treasurer, Mary Novak to attend Town Law Review Seminar. Carried 3-0.

Motion/LaMar: Second/Wright to approve the Claims and Correspondence. Carried 3-0.

LBAE meeting to be held on May 19 at 6:00.

Reconvened Property Inspection meeting to be held May 26th at 3:30, Summer Hire Interview to be held May 26th at 6:00.

Quarterly Audit was completed by the supervisors, all claims were found accurate and in order. Motion/Wright: Second/Hammond to approve the audit. Carried 3-0.

Motion/Wright: Second/LaMar to remove Mettler from EVFCU account and the NSB accounts and to add Hammond on all accounts. Carried 3-0.

Meeting adjourned by LaMar at 8:52 p.m.

Meeting Minutes

May 5, 2022

Pending Approval

Present: Board: Gustave Schroeder, Jerry Meier, Lisa Gibson;
Trustees: Janine Patten, Bonnie Meier, Sue Beaton; **Members Present:** Chris & Rodney Dale, Roland Fowler, Floyd Joki, Tana & Mike Johnson, Darwin Salo, Tim Sipha, Doug Mattson, Lori Lilenthal

Call to Order. Gus called the meeting to order at 6:34 pm.

Minutes: The minutes of the March 31st meeting were distributed. Gus asked for any changes; there were none. *Doug moved to accept the minutes. Roland seconded. Motion carried.*

Treasurer Report. Jerry provided a detailed accounting of the checking and savings accounts. He highlighted our insurance bill has been paid, and we have received a donation from the Credit Union. *Lisa motioned to accept the treasurer's report. Doug seconded. Motion carried.*

Old Business

- Timber Hall Doors/Building Maintenance Priorities. Gus reviewed the list of maintenance items discussed last month and the resulting priorities. The top four are: replace the side and back doors, repair/maintain the building exterior, repair the floor inside Timber Hall, and purchase two tents for the Fair. Tana presented her findings regarding potential grants: AEOA and Lake Country Power both fit our needs.
- AEOA. Tana explained that we are in good position to be awarded a Business Energy Retrofit (BER) grant and raised the need for a grant committee to expand our network and make decisions. Jerry moved that we proceed with the AEOA application and work through the details as we go. Roland seconded. Jerry will work with Tana to resubmit our application. Anyone interested in joining this committee should contact Jerry Meier.
 - Lake Country Power. Tana explained that this grant is up to \$3000. Sue moved that replacing the two outdoor tents for the Fair would be a good fit. Janine seconded. Gus will work with Tana and provide product descriptions and cost estimates to meet the May 14 application deadline. Jerry will complete the application and sent to Tana.
 - Secretary. Janine presented a job description of the secretary's duties to help recruit a new secretary. This description will be circulated in the community and at the pancake breakfast.
- "How to Put On the Embarrass Region Fair" – Sue distributed a template for each event chair to use as a guide to document what they do, who they contact, and recommendations for a successful event. Sue will format and assemble each contribution into a handbook. Submissions are welcome anytime with the goal of a completed handbook in September.

New Business. Pancake Breakfast. Jerry stated that March and April sales were the best this year. Gus verified that there will be enough volunteers and supplies for May 7.

- Kitchen rental during Fair. Sue stated that her brother, Dave Iverson, is interested in serving breakfast and lunch in the kitchen. He is not a food truck vendor currently but was in the past. Our fee and insurance were discussed. Jerry said he would find out if Dave would be covered under Timber Hall insurance for serving food or if he would have to purchase insurance for the two days he would serve. Regarding the fee, Lisa moved that the set price for renting the kitchen be \$350 for the weekend OR a percentage of Dave's gross sales during the Fair. Sue to negotiate. Chris seconded. Motion passed.
- Pony Rides. Sue suggested that the vendor fee be waived. Discussion resulted in no change.
- Meeting Date. During the winter, the Fair board has met on the Thursday before the first Saturday to accommodate plowing and staffing the pancake breakfast. Discussion resulted in a final vote to return the meeting to the third Thursday of the month, including May 19, as there is much business to discuss regarding the Fairbook and grant deadlines.
- Timber Hall/Pole Building Storage update. Jerry reported that there are no updates on building rental and the storage building will be empty this weekend.

FAIR Business (August 26-28)

- Festival.net update (Janine) – moved to next meeting.
- Fairbook advertising deadline is May 15. Amber is working on the Fair book and it will be available for review at the May 19 meeting.
- Fair event chairs. All fair events have a coordinator except the exhibit building and the parade. Anyone interested should contact j9patten@yahoo.com, call or text 218-391-7896.

We are also seeking a website designer. Anyone interested should contact Jerry Meier, jerry@mnmeier.net, call or text 218-984-3506.

Cancelled this year: ALS Dunk Tank and Queen Competition.

Team Penning (August 19-21)

- Doug explained the need for a Squeeze Shoot and Buckles. The estimated cost is \$2,800 for the squeeze shoot and the buckles usually are funded through sponsorships. Jerry moved that the Fair buy the squeeze shoot. Chris seconded. Motion passed.
- Team Penning is a large part of the Embarrass Region Fair. In fact, so big that it had to move to a separate weekend to accommodate all of the entries and fans. Admission is free.

Miscellaneous: Tana stated that the Fair needs a Web site to really promote itself as a non-profit. Jerry stated that we have the domain but no one to design the Web page. Gus will be following up with suggestions provided by the membership.

Doug made a motion to adjourn. Lisa seconded. Motion carried. Gus adjourned the meeting at 8:05 pm.

*** OBITUARY ***

Ira G. White “Menoominikeijin”, 83

Ira G. “Mike” White “Menoominikeijin”, 83, of Embarrass, died on April 15, 2022, in his home of natural causes. A memorial service was held on May 7 at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Tower with Pastor Liz Cheney officiating.

Mike was born on Sept. 5, 1938, in Hayward, Wis., the son of Ira O. and Evelyn (Morgan) White. He graduated from Orr High School. He married Janet Marie Rasula on Nov. 10, 1956. They made their home in Mt. Iron prior to moving to Embarrass about 27 years ago. Mike was employed at the Pioneer Underground Mine in Ely and later at Minntac. He was a jack-of-all trades with the ability to fix anything. He always had a work project to putz on, whether it was repairing cars, painting them, or welding; he also loved to go ricing.
