Meeting was called to order at 6:03 pm by Zane Beaton with Pledge of Allegiance.

Bernard Mettler was appointed as the new board supervisor. 2-1. Bernie gives Oath of Office.

Maintenance report was given by Roy.

Campground- Maintenance has been working on the MDH requirements.

Roads report was given by Zane. Roads have been graded and are looking good. Some roads need gravel. *Zane motions to get quotes for gravel. Second by Roy. Carried 3-0.*

No incident reports have been documented the last two years on Hanka Nevala by the sheriff's department. Visitor states that corners need to be cut back of brush. Brush will be cut back on the properties allowed, when conditions permit. *Motion by Roy for final approval of the Prospectors Trail on Hanka Nevala Road. Second by Zane. Carried 3-0.*

Discussion was held on the Post Office Project. 76 Union Station demolition has been complete. Two grants with the total amount of \$47,800 from the IRRRB have been granted. Waiting on the boring to be done on 14th to move forward. Next Post Office Project meeting will be held on the 24th at 6 pm.

Some visitors expressed their concerns. Most feel the township needs to move forward with the project and get it done. Post Office Project was tabled until the meeting on the 24th at 6 pm.

Property Inspections were done on June 26, Zane went through the report. *Motion by Roy to purchase a pressure washer. Second by Zane. Carried 3-0.* Suggestions from residents were given and added to the list. Pyhala Homestead was discussed and what can be done about it. Quotes have been asked by contractors but they have never returned with an estimate on what it would cost to do repairs. Some feel it would be a drain on taxpayers to do repairs. Grants from Historical Society were mentioned for the fixing of the Pyhala Homestead. Might be possible grant money for signs also. Gene suggest clerk goes to grant writing class.

Chris Alaspa has been working on the Little League field along with the help of volunteers. He expressed his gratitude with C&C Winger and Seppi, who have donated their time and materials to help. Portion of the money has been raised for a new scoreboard. Chris asks the board to help out with scoreboard costs and other projects he has planned to improve the Little League field. Chris has purchased some items for the improvements already. *Motion by Bernie to give \$3,421.00 out of recreation fund for the improvements of Little League Field. Second by Roy, Carried 3-0.*

After careful consideration of the applications received for part time maintenance the board made the decision. *Motion by Roy to hire Jack Lamar. Second by Zane. Bernie abstained. Carried 2-0.*

Motion by Zane, to get Bernie Mettler on all accounts with Northern State Bank and Embarrass Vermillion Credit Union, and remove Joe Scherer. Second by Roy. Carried 2-0.

Motion by Bernie to approve the Treasurer's Report. Second by Zane. Carried 3-0.

Motion by Zane to accept the Correspondence and Claims (16513-16544) \$9,583.22, payroll \$6,225.75. Second by Bernie. Carried 3-0.

Meeting adjourned at 7:43 pm.

Insurance fund to stay the same at \$8,500. Motion carried 18-0.






