PENDING BOARD APPROVAL**

Visitors: Gene Wright, Mickey White

Meeting was called to order by LaMar with the Pledge of Allegiance at 6:00 p.m.

October minutes reviewed. Motion LaMar/Lee to accept and approve the minutes as presented. Carried 3-0.

Treasurer Report presented by Novak. September and October were discussed. Motion LaMar/Garman to approve the Treasurers Report. Carried 3-0.

AT&T representatives discussed FirstNet phone service that they are offering to the township officials. First responders and Public Safety Professionals get prioritized connectivity.

Visitor emails discussed and it is requested that a written proposal with where the signs are wanted to be placed and what information should be on them. Also suggest that maybe a sign committee should be formed.

SISU Heritage, Inc., the joker will not be moved from the Pyhala Homestead to the Nelimark Museum as discussed because the joker is too rusted.

Maintenance Report by Lee. Report on file. Ford F150 has been having mechanical issues and should be looking into a replacement. Watching sites for a replacement truck should be done and figuring a budget to purchase. Plow truck needs appropriate tires for winter and plowing. Electrical problems discussed. Need to get verification of the problem and go over options on how to solve the problem. Second maintenance worker has agreed to be on a on call basis, but Lee believes it may be a good idea to have a second on call position. *Motion Lee/Garman to post an ad for a second on-call position for maintenance at up to 28 hours a week. Carried 3-0.*

Cemetery Report given by Garman. Garman has been busy with burials and work at the cemetery. Garman seeded the new area he cleared out. LaMar suggests putting together a

scope of work for a licensed sprayer to spray an applicator at the cemetery to control the weeds. Lee is worried about the chemicals that may be sprayed. Garman is concerned nobody will respond to the scope of work.

Road Report by Garman. Garman drove the roads and feels they are in pretty good shape.

Request for Proposal was presented to the board to review. *Motion LaMar/Lee to release the RFP as presented. Carried 3-0.* End date for proposals to be received will be December 17th by 2:00 p.m.

Blessing Cupboards / Outside Food Pantry idea was presented by Lee to have one here at the Town Hall for those who may need dry and canned food in tough times. Just an idea currently in hopes to become a project in the near future. All supervisors are in favor of this idea. Looking for someone to lead this project.

Lee spoke with the lawyer about past meeting discussions. Lawyer was unable to get in touch with residents. Lee informed him of contact information she has.

Looking into one property expense at every meeting to see what costs are for each one. Rink property is first on the list. Breaking up the costs for properties should include the hours maintenance spend on working at township properties. Rink liner was discussed and has not been ordered and most likely too late to do so now. LaMar has stepped down as the contacting businesses for advertising. Garman to check on some poly liner that may possibly work.

Motion Garman/Lee to accept the Claims and Correspondence. Carried 3-0.

Novak speaks about changing the website to .gov as required.

Clerk prints out financial reports for supervisors.

Quarter audit was completed. Motion Garman/Lee to approve the audit finding nothing incorrect or out of order. Carried 3.

Meeting adjourned at 8:32 by Lee.

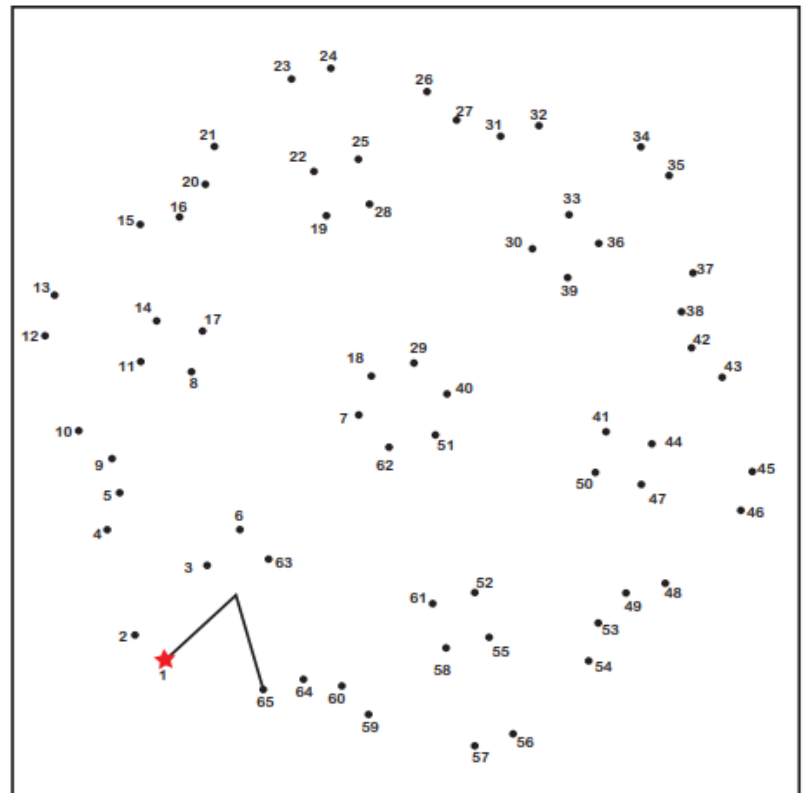




Tart Dough

3 - 3 ½ c flour
 1 c butter
 1 tsp salt
 8-ounce carton cottage cheese
 ¼ c milk, to soften

Prune Filling

1-pound pitted prunes
 3 c water
 ½ c sugar

Finnish Tarts



Blend dough ingredients with pastry blender, adding milk to soften as needed. Form into 2 balls and cover to chill overnight. Cook the prunes in water until soft. Add sugar and mix well. Roll out dough and cut into 3-inch squares. Place a mound of filling in the center of each square. Using a knife, split each corner from the top to within ½ inch of the center. Fold every other corner to the center and pinch these 4 pieces together – like a pinwheel. Place pinwheels on an ungreased cookie sheet and bake in a 400-degree oven for 7 – 10 minutes or until slightly browned. Remove and cool on rack.
