Meeting was called to order by Lee at 6:08 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance.

September minutes reviewed. *Motion Lee/Garman approve the minutes as written. Carried 2-0.*

Treasurer's Report reviewed. *Motion Lee/Garman to approve the Treasurer's Report as presented. Carried 2-0.*

Maintenance Report was reviewed. On file.
Motion Lee/Garman to convert one maintenance position to an on-call as needed up to 28 hours per week with the on needs to be determined by lead maintenance. Carried 2-0.

Road Report by Garman. Few of the roads were graded by county.

Campground Report. Campground Host volunteered hours and labor to add an additional site and removal of tree stumps. Horse Campsites have been asked about. Supervisors like the idea of horse campsites but township is not currently in the position right now to develop a plan, budget and funding currently. If there are any residents that would like to develop a committee for this idea they are welcome to come speak with the board.

Cemetery improvements have been completed by Garman. Waiting for rain to seed in the new cleared area. Garman has worked countless hours at the Cemetery and

much appreciation to Eric. Discussion was had on the five hundred dollars that was donated to the cemetery. Platform and public benches are of interest. Mowing schedule at the Cemetery was discussed. Cemetery Deeds signed.

Lee would like to see one area each meeting to dig into expenses. *Motion Lee/Garman at watch meeting to examine each area of expenses and income for each property and activity. Carried 2-0.*

Garman speaks on Firstnet cell service. *Motion Lee/Garman to meet with Firstnet for a presentation. Garman to set up meeting date. Carried 2-0.*

Motion Lee/Garman to reimburse Clerk and Deputy for cost of food provided for contractors. Carried 2-0.

Garman discusses the scope of work for township brushing RFP information. Clerk will type up the RFP.

Motion Lee/Garman to send half deposit down on the Nelimark Roof project and the remaining money to be given within two days of roof completion after inspected. Carried 2-0.

Motion Lee/ Garman to ask township attorney to attend a board meeting. Carried 2-0.

Motion Lee/Garman to approve the claims and correspondence. Carried 2-0.

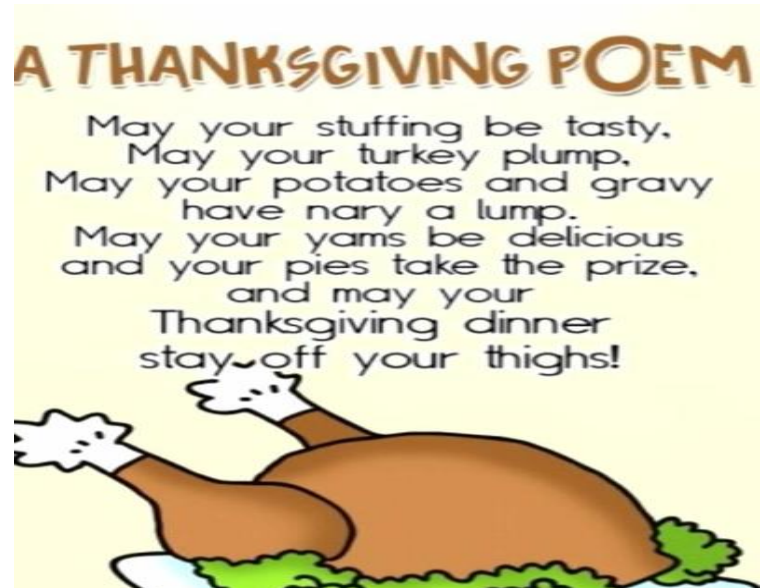

Ardell "Art" Lloyd Thoreson, 92, of Virginia, formerly of Embarrass, passed away peacefully on Oct. 14, 2025, at Essentia Medical Center in Virginia, with his wife and family by his side. Services were held by Pastor Christina Forsythe at Hope Lutheran Church in Embarrass on Oct. 27, followed by lunch at Embarrass Town Hall. Interment was in the Embarrass Cemetery. Ardell was born on March 19, 1933, to Carl and Emma Giving Thoreson in Hazel. He grew up in the Goodridge area. He enlisted in the U.S. Army in 1953 and served stateside, being the Korean conflict ended just before he was to be shipped overseas. He retired as SP2 Sargent in 1956. Upon discharge he obtained his private flying license. After working various jobs, Art went to work for Erie (LTV) in April 1956, and loving his job, worked there for 39 years in the Locomotive Department.

Ardell was a craftsman who created violins from the raw wood that he cut down. He would cut, slit, dry, and shape it into a musical instrument. It was then tuned to frequency.
