**Town of Embarrass  
Regular Board Meeting  
September 13, 2017  
Pending Board Approval**

Present: Zane Beaton, Roy Worsham, Bernie Mettler, Mary Novak, Jennifer Boese

Visitors: Cindy Koivisto, Gene Wright, Paul Knuti, Bill Wright

The meeting was called to order at 6:03 pm by Zane Beaton with The Pledge of Allegiance.

*Motion by Zane to approve August minutes. Second by Roy. Carried 3-0.*

*Motion by Roy to accept the Treasures Report. Second by Bernie. Carried 3-0.*

**Reports:**

Maintenance Report was given by Roy. Continuous mowing of township properties. Holes patched at Town Hall driveway. Four picnic tables assembled and put in place. Broken window at Pyhala Farm repaired. Two trees removed from Nelmark. Hockey net restrung at rink. Repairs made to mowers. Removed huge hornets nest at Town Hall outhouse. Dirt placed on grave and seeded. Weeds dug up all along chain link fence at Town Hall. Finished working on old flower bed at Weather Station. Open/Closed sign finished and hung at campground entrance. Pressure washed outhouse and patio areas at Info Center. Repairs done on garage door at cemetery. Several grave stones reset. Pressure washed weather station building, ready to paint and all regular maintenance duties. Summer hires last day was August 31st. (Roy told the boys he would like to see them return next summer if they are interested)

Campground Report was given by Caretaker. Cindy explains that the water at campground is still rusty and suggests to the board someone else is called besides Culligan. Board says to call Culligan and explain to them something is wrong and needs to be looked at. The river sites were not booked this year during the fair, all the other sites were full and everything went well during the fair weekend. A camping patron that has been at

campground all summer long is asking to possibly stay two weeks longer. Cindy asks to stay longer as well. Board sees no problem and says to play it by ear. Board says it will be Rogers call when the water should be shut off. Board looks over letter received by Dick Tornow asking to be maintenance caretaker of the campground. The board would like Dick to come to a meeting. There will be no final decision till later.

Roads Report was given by Zane. The roads look good and the gravel was placed on the roads that needed filling. Clerk to contact Dennis to go to Info Center and smooth the driveway.

**New Business:**

The board discussed the issue with a resident's property line. *Tabled until the resident can come and speak with the board.*

Roy has been trying to get in touch with contractors who will give quotes on what work needs to be done at the Pyhala. Calls are not being returned. Visitor explains that there is people that specialize in rock foundation, they just need to be found. With any work that may be done it has to be brought to the Minnesota Historical Society attention and be approved. Visitor says the property is beautiful and needs to be kept up and that the inside of the buildings should be cleaned. (Clerk notes that the property has since been brushed more by maintenance) Visitor would also like to see proper signage for the Pyhala Homestead with the unique history of the land and buildings. Visitor complimented Mike Salo on his great job of being tour guide and has been told by others what a great experience it was.

Roger has seen evidence of ants eating away at the Info Center. Powder has been spread around to kill them off, but doesn't seem to be working. It is suggested that an exterminator is called in before too much damage is done. *Motion by Bernie to have Info Center exterminated for ants. Second by Roy. Carried 3-0.*

*Motion by Zane to have maintenance get the trailer looked at to see if bearings are needed and to be repaired if so, wait till spring to get new tires on trailer if trailer is not used during the winter. Second by Bernie. Carried 3-0.*

**Old Business:**

Bernie gives an update on the Post Office Project. Addy Heating has suggested four block row. (Clerk has since spoke with Bill Addy and he suggest having overhead heating, pictures and notes from clerk were sent to Bill. A quote will be sent to office on the heating.) Waiting on C&C Winger to put in septic tank. McGregor will be moving the building to the site by the end of the month. Well water has passed the test, we have plenty of good water. A sleeve was put in the slab for water. A support post or some sort of support will be placed under the building the board stated after a visitor asked. Will be checking to see if windows need some type of security. Corey from C&C Winger is ready to move forward. Clerk informs the board that an architect from the USPS will be coming to the Post Office site on Tuesday at 10am and would like to meet with the board if possible. Clerk will post for the meeting. Clerk informed the board about an invoice received for \$24,046.97, amount paid by grant for this invoice was \$11,046.97. *Motion by Bernie to transfer \$13,000 from Campground fund into the Post Office fund to pay the remaining amount due on invoice. Second by Bernie. Carried 3-0. Motion by Zane to accept the two new quotes. Second by Roy. Carried 3-0.* (Clerk attended permit hearing on Sept. 14 and the conditional use permit was granted)

*Motion by Zane to approve correspondence and claims 16577-16610 (\$60,861.46), Payroll (\$7,311.82). Second by Bernie. Carried 3-0.*

Quarterly audit was done and all claims found to be in proper and correct order.

Meeting adjourned at 8:00 pm.

Post Office Project Meeting**

September 19, 2017, 10:00 am at the Project Site

**Pending Board Approval**

Present: Zane Beaton, Roy Worsham, Bernie Mettler, Jennifer Boese; Visitors: Todd Saterbak (USPS Project Manager)

Todd Saterbak shows the board the plans that he has for the building. Todd discusses the ramp and was wondering if there would be room with where the well is going. After measuring it was concluded there is plenty of room. Crawlspace will be heated so there will be no freezing. The existing heating and cooling systems that are currently in the building are not up to code for what the Post Office will be doing to the inside of building. Clerk to contact Addy to show him the heating plans. *Motion by Bernie to re-contact Addy with the heating plans given by Todd and to also advise Addy we need a whole new heating system needs to be up to USPS specs, and to plan*

*for central air system at the same time. Second by Zane. Carried 3-0* (Clerk notes: Clerk has emailed, called and sent letter to Addy, waiting on response) Lobby will be heated and it will be a 24 hour lobby. The slab has been insulated. Roy informs Todd that the pressure tank and pump is in the well. We have to get the heating system and get the water up to the floor and the Post Office will take it from there. Todd informed the board that there will be new windows and doors on the front of the building and it will be wrapped in cedar, along with a Post Office sign on the front. Todd States that Morcon Construction from the cities will be doing the construction for the USPS. Todd asks clerk to send the boards contact information to him, also to give Janice the Tower Postmaster his information so she may contact him with any questions or concerns that she may have. Todd says he will email the plans to the clerk. *Motion by Roy to put the heater, air conditioning unit that are currently in the building and the Cub Cadet up for bids. Bids to be received by October 11 at 3:00pm. Second by Zane. Carried 3-0.* Clerk to contact Lake Connections to check with them on running lines for the phone and internet. (Clerk notes: Have contacted Lake Connections and received application for service and forwarded it to USPS to fill out)

A walk through the construction area was done by all present and are happy with the progress that has been done.

Meeting was called to order at 7:15 p.m. by Board Chair Mitch Lind and the Pledge of Allegiance followed.

**Minutes Approval:** Phil moved to approve the July 11, 2017 Regular Meeting Minutes. Mitch supported. Carried 3-0. Minutes from the Special Board Meeting held on July 20, 2017 were approved by Emily & supported by Phil. Carried 3-0.

**Treasurer's Report from July Meeting:** Receipts: MATIT Insurance Trust (Workers Comp Dividend) \$435, State of MN (Township Aid) \$819. Total Disbursements \$1516.92, all from General Fund. Emily accepted the report and Mitch supported. Carried 3-0.

**Approval to Pay Bills:** Emily moved to approve payment of all bills listed on the agenda with support from Phil. Carried 3-0.

**Visitors Addressed:** Fire Chief Tom Martin stated that when 911 was called to notify them of closure of South Skarp Road the Fire Department was not notified. It was assumed that 911 would take care of the F.D. notification. Tom was assured that the F.D. would be personally called if any closures happen again.

Creighton Cox asked that the Heikkila Road sign be replaced as soon as possible. Phil said St. Louis County has been notified of this but he will check on it again.

**Road Report:** The Kaunonen Lake Road Bridge construction will resume in about 2 weeks. The deck materials have been received.

**Clerk's Note:** At the Special Town Meeting tonight just previous to this meeting, an application to MNDOT funding was considered. Emily will contact Sue Rowe to get more info and will ask if we qualify for this funding. We are waiting to hear from SEH Company to get us a rough estimate for having a design drawn up for rebuilding a half mile section of South Skarp Road.

The public is reminded that it is a felony to drive on a legally closed road, such as So. Skarp When people have

continued to drive on So. Skarp as they have been, they have caused even more damage to it. Waasa Township has the power to press charges on offenders. St. Louis County has communicated that they will not grade or snowplow a road that is closed. Phil will check into more signage for South Skarp.

**Old Business:** Emily will pick up the new cemetery sign this week from Mesabi Community College, engineering department. We received the bill for the materials tonight, \$150.00 for the piece of 4 foot x 3 foot brushed aluminum. Mitch will install the sign in the upper part of the cemetery.

**New Business:** Lakes Gas Company quoted the price of \$.999/gallon of propane for the up-coming season. Emily motioned to accept this price and Mitch supported. Carried 3-0. The Clerk will ask for a written agreement.

Residents, the Mahoney's request the use of tables and chairs on the weekend of August 19. Approved.

The Clerk plans to attend the MAT District 10 Meeting in Grand Lake Town Hall of August 24, 2017. Approved.

**Correspondence:** Emily received a form was received from the U.S. Census Department. She will fill it out and get it mailed or do it on-line. All other mail was read and filed.


**Adjournment:** Emily moved to close the meeting at 8:00 p.m. and was supported by Mitch.

# Cemetery Rules

(Effective May 1, 2003)

1. All flowers, natural or artificial must be in a planter-not a tripod stand. A maximum of two planters are allowed per grave site. Shepherd hooks are allowed. **However, flowers may be planted directly in the ground within a one-foot width bordered with patio blocks from the front of a headstone only.** No planting around footstones is allowed. The patio block border must be flush to the ground and be approved by a member of the town board before placement may begin.

2. Planters must be sturdy and moveable (for mowing) and must have the deceased person's name on them. Planters and veteran flag holders are to be placed near the headstone or footstone if possible.

3. Planters are allowed at the cemetery one week before Memorial Day and **MUST** be removed by October 15<sup>th</sup>. If not removed, the township has the right to confiscate planters without notification.

4. Statues are not permitted unless they serve as planters. Windsocks, non-US flags, balloons, models, banners, pinwheels etc. are not permitted.

5. Due to cemetery maintenance safety factors, decorations on wire hangers or objects anchored to the ground with wire are not allowed and will be removed by the maintenance crew.

6. The Town Board assumes no responsibility for the care and watering of plants. The township has the right to remove all wilted flowers at their discretion without notice.

7. No lot shall be used for any other purpose than burial of human remains and the placement of appropriate memorials as permitted by cemetery rules.

8. The Town Board reserves the right to change these rules as they deem necessary. Lot owners must comply with the rules in place at the time of burial even if different rules existed at time of lot purchase.

9. The Embarrass Cemetery will be open at all times. However, the Town Board may close access to the cemetery as the board deems necessary.

10. No planting of trees, shrubs, bushes or any other type of landscaping will be allowed other than by the Town Board.





We so appreciated Mike's time and enthusiasm, and have mentioned this wonderful summer day adventure to many.


